Learned Counsel for the petitioner. Petitioner claims that he submitted an application to respondent for supply of natural gas on 25.11.2013. The respondent issued demand notice on 20.07.2017 and the petitioner deposited Rs.2500/- as per demand notice but the respondent failed to install the natural gas supply connection and that the petitioner send legal notice of the respondent but in vain leading the petitioner to file his claim in this courts. Respondent did not turned up despite the notices were properly served on him and respondent was proceeded against Ex-parte on previous date fixed i.e. 16.05.2018. The petitioner produced oral as well as documentary evidence. I have heard the arguments and have gone through the record that the evidence produced by petitioner is sufficient to prove his claim there is nothing contrary on record against claim of the petitioner. In view of that the petition is accepted however the claim up damages and costs of Rs.130,000/- is too excessive. Petition is accepted to the extent of Rs. 50,000/-. File is consigned.
